

Quality of the cards is not inspiring. Printing is a bit dull, cards don't separate from each other easily, it is hard to sort them once you are done (since they don't have the curved edge that helps with sorting), cards have an odd camber to them -- they are slightly bent in a way that just doesn't feel

right when you are handling it. I guess you get what you pay for. I have used flash cards in the past for my kind made by Trend Enterprises. Their cards were a total joy to use, clear crisp printing, it felt nice to handle the cards. Those sorts of things matter when you are trying to make otherwise dull activity of learning to tell time into fun. On the positive side, these are cheap, I'm guessing they have good educational material on them -- I just can't get myself or my kids to use them much! ;)

A fun way to teach a child to tell time and how to count money. Some teens today with a job as a cashier don't even know how to make change unless the register tells them the amount. I used to have to count the change back from a register total that did not tell you the amount of change needed. That is why they had to change the registers to show the amount of change to give the customer. And a lot of kids can't tell time on a regular clock face. They have to read a digital readout to tell you what time it is.

My son learned to tell time with this....Great product.

I'm surprised how well these worked. My son finally picked up on telling time...so quickly in fact that I had to add in additional challenges, "what time is it 15 minutes from now? What time was it 45 minutes ago?"

These are great cards. My kids can work on time and money. Two important concepts to learn.

Time and Money flashcards have been a very helpful tool while teaching my 5 young kids how to be quick to figure out what time it is, or how much money is before them. We matched real coins with the cards and then each one of my kids had to figure out how much money they had displayed, and what kind of coins and who much each coin was worth, etc. They also got to earn the coins that they identified and counted correctly; it was a really great way to for the kids to earn a little extra cash and it was a great way for them to have some hands-on learning time (one-on-one time with Momma).

Kids picked up on it quik. Easier than school can teach. The school should buy these and use them. Might have better success.

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
