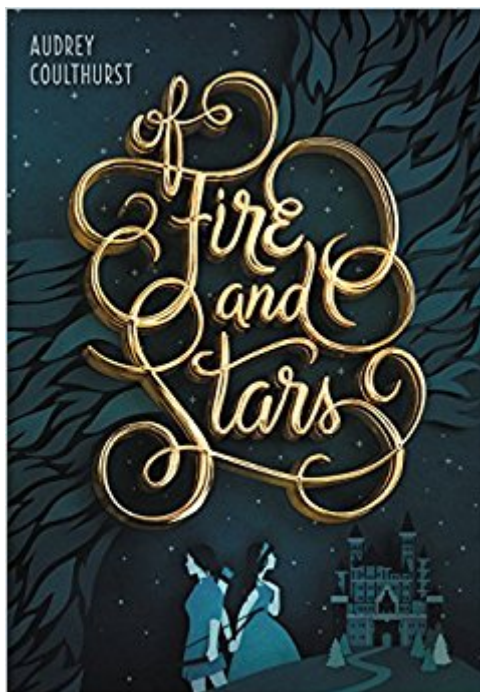


The book was found

Synopsis

Betrothed since childhood to the prince of Mynaria, Princess Dennaleia has always known what her future holds. Gr 8 Up In this fantasy world of kings and magic, Princess Dennaleia has been groomed for her most important task: to marry Prince Thandilimon in order to solidify the relationship between their kingdoms. It is a future that she fully embraces, hindered only by her secret magical affinity for

handling and creating fire, which she has kept hidden and cannot control. Upon her arrival in the kingdom of Mynaria, Denna is paired with Princess Amaranthine (Mare), who is to give her riding lessons in preparation for the wedding day. Mare's standing in her own kingdom is somewhat tenuous, as she has very little interest in her duties as a princess and prefers to spend her time riding and training horses. The two strike up a friendship amid a series of royal murders and terrorist acts supposedly orchestrated by renegade magic users and separatists. The real focus is on the attraction and love that soon develop between Denna and Mare. As they work to solve the murders and mysteries, the teens fall in love and begin to question their predestined roles. Same-sex love is neither forbidden nor controversial in Mynaria, so the novel's theme does not center on LGBTQ issues. It is simply a love story that just happens to be about two women, and the setting and plot are tangential. Some mild sexual scenes make this appropriate for older readers. VERDICT Those looking for a complex sci-fi/fantasy may be a little unsatisfied with the narrative. However, the gentle LGBTQ romance will win over many teens. —Patricia Feriano, Montgomery County Public Schools, MD

So, the book just came out today, I thought to read the first chapter or three. Eight hours later I finished my 'quick preview'. The book was a little slow starting but meticulously researched and with characters that grew on you. The mystery reveal was barely telegraphed, but looking back was quite apparent. Nicely done. No little flowers of princesses here. We are led to slowly meet and learn the major characters, and by the end, they are dear friends of ours, and I am saddened to see them go. 400 pages, devoured cover to cover, and wouldn't be upset to see more. Thank you.

It's a pretty short book, YA 400 pages only took me about an afternoon to read, so it's great to pick up since it's an adventure without a massive time investment just by itself. I was very satisfied with the storyline of the book and enjoyed the themes and the characters. But the characters didn't develop as much as you saw more of their personality through time. There was a pretty good twist, and it was foreshadowed well without giving it away. I can't really get into it without massive spoilers, but I can say that there were plenty of loose ends and the pacing of the book had a lot to be desired. I kept getting bored in the first half of the book and accidentally skipping paragraphs. Also, the horses were described more than the people, so it's pretty clear that this is a dialogue-driven story. It would translate to a visual medium pretty well, though. The second half is worth the patience but good pacing and would of fixed my antsy-ness. But the pacing did contribute to the tone and 'feels' of the first half of the book so I'm a little conflicted about changing it. If you don't like books that change POV, don't pick this up, as it switched between the two heroines every chapter. Their "voice" of the writing wasn't any different between the two lovely ladies and sadly I was often confused on who I was reading at the time. Being a first person book without writing voice-style change between POV changes is just a bummer and probably the biggest disappointment, especially since the author has a master's in writing. Nonetheless, it was a fun adventure and I enjoyed living it with them. I would definitely pick up a part two if the author plans to make one. tl;dr: if you enjoy royal drama and gals bein' pals, pick it up. but don't expect a masterpiece.

While I think that this book could have benefited from additional character development (in some cases it was difficult to feel sympathetic toward even the two main protagonists, because they seemed immature and shallow) and additional plot development (too many things were rushed or glossed over, possibly in an attempt to keep the page count reasonable), I thought it was excellent,

and well worth the cost and time spent. All in all, I felt that it was far better than many books that are published from far more established authors. The story and the writing put me a little bit in mind of Katherine Kurtz's Deryni Chronicles, which I read and enjoyed many years ago. I hope that this story, like that one, continues for many more sequels to come. If it does, I'll be first in line to buy them.
