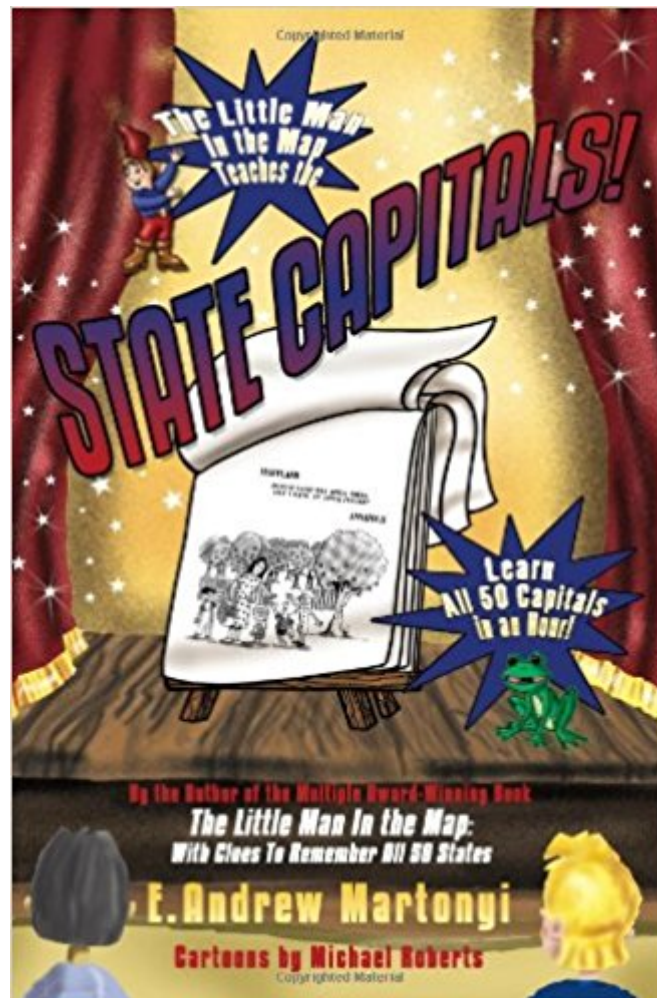

A How To Use section explaining the simple and effective method is followed by an alphabetical listing where a two-page spread is devoted to each state/capital unit. The left-hand page establishes word clues based on word associations derived from the sounds of the names of the state and its capital; the facing page brings the word clues together in two to four rhymed lines placed under a humorous cartoon that reinforces the story. The book will appeal to a wide range of ages, from elementary to high school students. They will surely be joined by some of their parents who will find themselves finally remembering even the more elusive state capitals.

When I handed it to my children (who are huge fans of MIM--aka "Man in the Map"), they couldn't wait to dig in. They quickly left the room and I didn't see them again for a good hour and a half. Once they emerged, I asked them how they liked it. My son said it was, "Funny and silly" and Abby agreed. "Yes, I know" I said, "but did you learn anything from it?" They replied, "No". (Umm...SHOCK!!!) "So you're telling me that you didn't learn any state capitals?" I asked incredulously. They shook their heads again. This of course, was totally unbelievable since I'd just gleaned quite a bit from it's pages. So I decided to quiz them. "Nothing, huh? Okay. What's the capital of Alaska?" Abby: "Juneau." "Arkansas?" Ethan: "Little Rock." "Maine?" Abby: "Augusta!" I fired-off more states, each yielding the correct answer from both. "Ha! You see? You did learn something!" I said, throwing my hands in the air. Abby was surprised and dumbfounded. "You mean, it wasn't just as silly story? Those are real places and names?" Isn't she cute, folks? So whether your children realize it or not, they will learn the capital cities of all fifty United States in record time! Many thanks once again to Mr. Martonyi and his supreme geographic geniusness! For example, the state of Florida and its capital Tallahassee have clues like: Florida = Flo and Ida Tallahassee = Tall and Sassy A hilarious cartoon depicts two women, Flo and Ida dancing on a stage wearing hats made of fruits that can be found in Florida. Teachers will love this handy tool in the classroom. Students can create their own helpful clues to remember the states. Parents who homeschool will love this too. Middle graders will laugh out loud while reading and learning about all of the states and capitals.
