

Laura Anderson is quite a story teller. Most of the characters are historical, but because this is alternate history, unlike a pure historical novel, you don't know what's going to happen. This is not a "chick book". The male characters are quite as interesting as the female, and Anderson is adept at switching from the point of view of one character to another. What if Anne Boleyn had borne Henry VIII a son who succeeded him as king? What would the young king be like? How would that have affected his sister Elizabeth? How would history be changed? These are fascinating questions, but the story would not work as a novel without interesting characters the reader cares about. Anderson brings it off, and does it well.

Even though this is an alternate history I did enjoy this book. The only episode I found tiresome was where Minuette thought Dominic had been sleeping with a French lady-in-waiting to King Henri's mistress. Then she promptly made a fool of herself. Guildford Dudley did wind up beheaded in factual history for marrying Lady Jane Grey, Northumberland wound up attainted and executed, Robert Dudley was a resident of The Tower, his wife wound up with a broken neck at the foot of the stairs, and Queen Elizabeth I nearly died of small pox which really freaked out her council. So many

of the factual events that occurred have been manipulated to work in a surviving son of Henry VIII, Henry IX
