

I bought this book as a result of my son preparing a genealogy that included my Guamanian wife's family after seeing it listed on the Internet as having references to her Japanese grandfather who had a substantial trading business based in Guam in the early 20th century and was pleasantly surprised to find that once starting it, I could not put it down. It was not only a thorough history of Guam since the days of Magellan, but an excellent study of colonialism under an exhausted Spanish empire and an American rule, primarily run by the Navy, that brought with it all its pre-1960 prejudices and Jim Crow laws. It is not very flattering to United States, Spain and Japan, which had a brief and cruel occupation, or for that matter to the Chamorran natives, but it is what a history should be - an honest appraisal of what happened. It also is amazing that so much could have occurred over many centuries in this small island that until quite recently never had more than 15,000 residents. It is well worth reading even if one has no connections to Guam.

Once I got past the rather flowery introduction about Magellan's sighting an discovery of Guam, I found this a fascinating, well-written, well-documented and well-researched book. It takes the reader through the discovery phase, Spanish colonial phase (and predictably brutal) the governing role of the US Navy, the Japanese occupation and finally, the American invasion to free Guam and the associated governmental transfer from the US Navy to the Department of the Interior.Certain recurring themes are summarized since the "post-contact" history of Guam from the 16th century to the present. These are:1). Close ties between Guam and Philippines.2).. Guam's geopolitical role in

support of imperial interest in Western Pacific (I.e Spain, US, Japan, US).3). Christianity - Roman Catholicism became abiding spiritual heritage of the people of the Marianas (including Guam), particularly for Chamorros (Original inhabitants from pre-contact days)- Patron system - privileges and elitism- Pare system - family ties and macho enthusiasm for military service,.4). Sheer incompetence of governments (Spanish, Japanese, US (both times>5). Chamorro people became peripheral in political and economic development of island under colonial military government.6 Resiliency of Chamorro people beneath heavy veneer of foreign acculturation.-Identify of family ties- Preservation of language in Chamorro homes. For those interested in Guam and the Marianas, these key themes must be kept in mind. Overall, a great read
