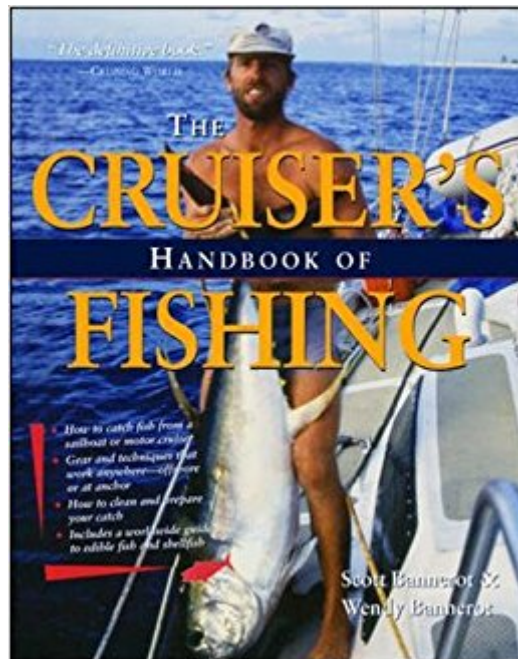

This book is amazing. Chock full of all sorts of fantastic information in an informative and often humorous way. I really enjoy all the anecdotes of personal experience/story telling to make the points editorialized. I can appreciate how difficult it must be to adequately describe certain aspects to the totally ignorant and uninformed. Regular fisherman or experienced folks may read and think, yeah, yeah, get to the point. Me? I'm one of those totally ignorant folks that wanna set sail and take up fishing from the back of the boat. Knowing what to get, how to use it, and troubleshoot what I'm doing wrong is EXACTLY what I bought this book for. It's also pretty much exactly what I had hoped it would be. There are times when I wish there was a video demonstration, or even some links referenced in the book regarding video demos on how to do this, or that. Plus, Scott's knowledge of various fish is quite impressive. Not much to dislike. My book arrived with the front cover bent from the packaging, so I may rip the binding off and laminate the front cover, then hole-punch it for a spiral binding. That way, it can be used somewhat as a text book or reference manual in several areas.

I found this to be a comprehensive, organized, thoughtful, well-written introduction to saltwater fishing. The text alternates between an instructional and a conversational style, with a mixture of solid, stepwise information -- and entertaining stories to demonstrate some of the key points. The black and white photos are informative and add to the text. The book covers a broad range of techniques and species, along with safety information, and practical advice on gear. The book is written from a cruising perspective but would be valuable to anyone engaging in marine fishing. The only drawback is that the book has not been updated since its 2003 publication, and portions are now somewhat out of date.

The Kindle edition had photos, tables and figures as far as the beginning of Chapter Two. After that, none. No pictures of the lures, hooks etc mentioned in the text. Despite being clearly written and very informative, without these illustrations, much value is lost. Can anyone suggest where or how I might be able to download the tables and figures separately?

I've only fished a few times so I really needed a basic book to help me get started. This is that book.

But if you are an experienced fisher, don't let the simplicity scare you. It is of great help for experienced fishers too. If you are going to be fishing while cruising (and let's face it, who isn't!) then this book should definitely be part of your on-board library.

I found this book to be both easy to read and very informative.. I have little to no knowledge of fishing and I found a wealth of practical hands on advice in this book. It seems to cover the subject in depth and lucidly with lots of antedotal stories to illustrate the topic. There are also lots of pictures and diagrams showing and illustrating what is being discussed. At the end of every chapter the authors also give a detailed suggested equipment list to help you get started with hands on application of that type of fishing. I have not had a chance to put this into practice but I no longer feel bewildered about how to get started or how to catch what with what equipment. I highly recommend this book
