

This is a biography of Jim McCann, and he does a good job of stressing the importance of opening a dialogue and starting a conversation with other people. Jim McCann talks about the changing communication mediums, and importance of effectively using each medium in opening a dialogue and start a conversation with others. This is not a TED Talk book, or public speaking book, but it is still a good read.

Unless you have the same personality as the author, you won't get much out of this book. According to a study, about 25-40% of the population is introvert. Perhaps the book is intended for those fit into the 60-75% of the population. For many introverts, talk is definitely not cheap.
