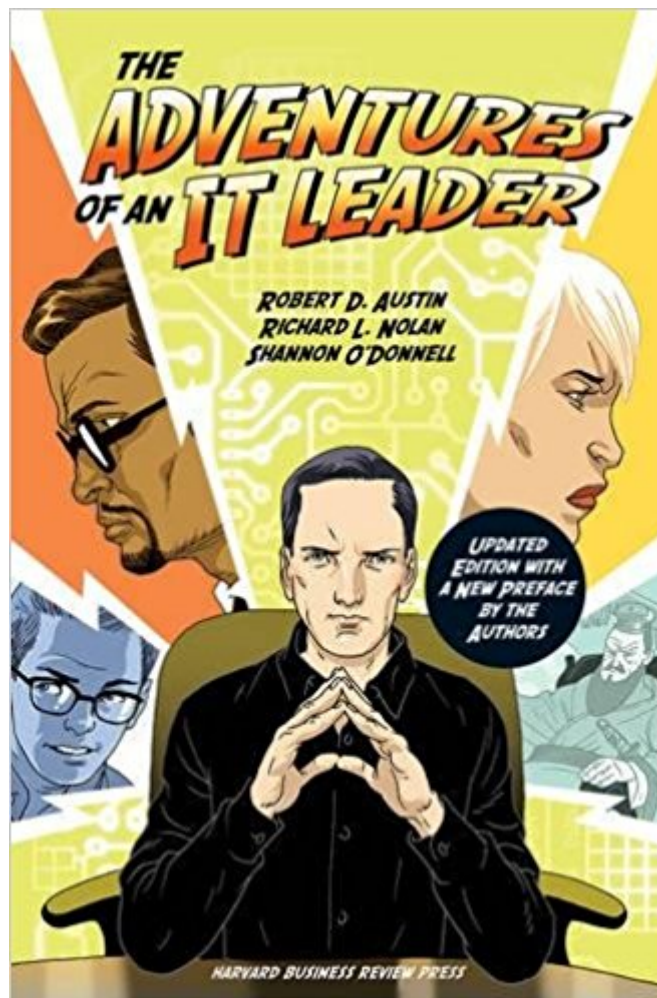

(For example, if you need to learn about crisis management and security, read chapters 10–12.) You can also test yourself and think about how to use the book's lessons in your own company by reading the authors' “Reflection” questions at the end of each chapter. This book is your indispensable manual for IT management and leadership, no matter what business you're in.
