

Escape into the world of a perfect straight A high school tennis player who finally realizes that her strive for perfection has caused her to miss out on life. Very relatable for anyone who has ever felt the need to be number one. I couldn't stop reading once I came to understand Cody Matthews, the fallen golden boy who was misunderstood and rejected by his peers. Hannah's journey to make friends and leave high school having a life other than her studies ends up uncovering secrets and may even lead to her perfect boyfriend. A must read for fans of gossip girl!!!!

I would like to say something positive. The spelling and grammar is good most of the time. That's why it has 2 stars, I guess. Word choice is occasionally atrocious. I am not that far into the book, and there have already been at least 3 truly awful word choices that any conscientious editor would have caught. ("Exacerbated" instead of "Exasperated", and "Conceded" instead of "Conceited" are two of them.) At this point in the story, there are exactly two isolated characters, each stuck in their own head, each having neither empathy nor imagination. Because of the genre, I know the characters will end up together, but to do it, they'll have to work together in the most established and predictable way. And they'll have to have difficult conversations. With each other, because there are no other characters. And everything will be direct. Even in tennis, Hannah's unerring serves are always direct. She's #1 in the state, you know, without coaching. Nothing subtle here. The blurb says this is an award-winning author. If the award was for writing, her editor must have been paying better attention to word choice that day.

What a cute YA. When I got to the end, I was actually sad it was over. I was looking forward to more of an epilogue, or a part 2 to Hannah and CodyÃƒÂ¢Ã ¬Ã ¸s story. I think Hannah is a different type of female protagonist, because she is way smart. Think of Diana from *Say Anything*. Valedictorian with no social life and itÃƒÂ¢Ã ¬Ã ¸s just her and her father. Cody though isnÃƒÂ¢Ã ¬Ã ¸t really a Loyd Dobler. He has a bad boy persona, but deep down he is all round good kid. He just doesnÃƒÂ¢Ã ¬Ã ¸t understand the reasons no one believes him. He

sacrifice a lot for others, but gets blamed for everything and anything bad. This has a total Gossip Girls/Gilmore Girls prep school hierarchy thing. The ÂfÂ¢Ã ¬Ã Å“popular, rich, trust fund kidsÃfÂ¢Ã ¬Ã Â• verse everyone else. The story is told from the POV mainly from Hannah, but we do get some little parts from Cody and Harrison. Hannah is sheltered. Ever since her mother left, she has only had her nerdy father as a friend and confidant. She realizes that going to college and having to talk about her high school experiences isnÂfÂ¢Ã ¬Ã â„¢t that easy, when she really didnÂfÂ¢Ã ¬Ã â„¢t have any. She was all around the best student and kept her head down. She didnÂfÂ¢Ã ¬Ã â„¢t wanted to be noticed and now at the end of her senior year, that is all she wants. Her goal is to go to the biggest end of the year party, with the elite of the schools social hierarchy. Problem, she doesnÂfÂ¢Ã ¬Ã â„¢t know how to infiltrate the social circles. She decides to blackmail one student (a former member of the popular clicks) to aid her in getting into the party. Hannah is sweet, and smart. She is pretty, but doesnÂfÂ¢Ã ¬Ã â„¢t know it. When she speaks, she talks more as if she is in a meeting or giving a presentation, instead as a regular teenager. She uses big words, and doesnÂfÂ¢Ã ¬Ã â„¢t think people understand her. She is athletic, because she plays tennis. The best tennis player in the state. However, her overall perceptive in life is, "if I am going to do it, I am going to be the best at it

This book started out okay and then fell through. There wasn't a lot of depth to any of the characters and a lot of questions went unanswered. Things were brought up that weren't even hinted at throughout the story. It felt like the book was missing a lot of things and just jumped around a lot. It was a good idea just poorly executed.
