

Excellent method and history, yet prayers do not fit modern life. For example there is a prayer to use when kindling the hearth for cooking but not when preparing or preheating a modern oven.

What does imaginative Christianity look like? Why are Christians so afraid to use their imaginations in prayer, preaching, teaching and serving? We've fallen prey to the "if it looks like a duck, it must be a duck" philosophy of Christian teachers who believe that Church History didn't exist prior to the Reformation and that "spirituality" is a "four letter" word that shouldn't be used by Christians. Esther De Waal does an excellent job of presenting this ancient prayer practice without the "starry eyed" nature of wishful thinking.

I have gone from knowing nothing about Celtic Spirituality to having a very firm foundation. De Waal shares her love of the subject with this very well researched book. Many reflective examples throughout. A great choice!

I have several books of Celtic prayers and blessings. When I first read them, I found that those people's sense of the holy is more personal, perhaps, than our more formal worship.
