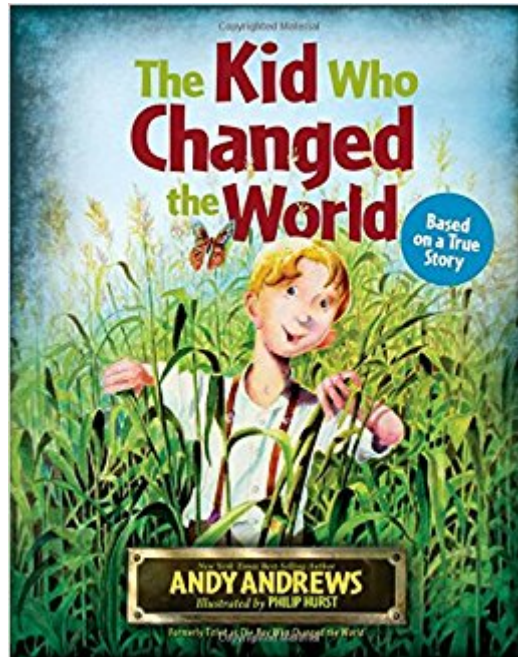

I was delighted with this book---- and how much more so when my husband, a retired "seedsman", verified the facts about these great men portrayed in this biography. After purchasing the first book for my own early-elementary age grandchildren, I ordered 8 more copies to give to agricultural families in our church. The only negative feeling that I got was in regard to the explanation of the "butterfly effect", though it seems this is a pet subject for the author.
