

At first I was reluctant to try an Amish book because I really like the Amish and thought the author might make them look silly because they are different. However, as my Kindle was offering it at a discount price, I took a second look. I liked the author's bio and decided to try a book. I should mention that we used to own a farm in an Amish community in Michigan and have interacted with them on several projects. My parents still own a farm there. The phone the Amish use sits on their property and they get invited to events within the community all the time. So, I did notice that are some differences between the Amish Sarah describes in the novel and those near our farm. (However, that is the case throughout the Amish in other parts of the country, because the pastor decides a lot of the things.) For example, near us: a newly married couple must move together from one family member's home to another for about 6 months before they get to live alone in their own home, if they can get one. Also those by us do not have roofs on their buggies, but use umbrellas only for inclement weather. About the book: It is engaging and respectful of the Amish, though somewhat critical of the Englishers. (However, as Sarah Price is a Mennonite that may be her experience too.) The characters are well developed and the book is clean so there are no drawn out descriptions of intimacy as is found in many romance books. Her story made me cry where anticipated and had me interested in knowing more about the families so I bought the second book right away. Good job Sarah Price!

Too short. HORRIBLE SPELLING ERRORS! Please, please hire someone to proofread your books before having them printed, Sarah Price. PLEASE! Really nice story though, well written plot. I enjoyed it very much. I just can't stand the spelling and grammatical errors in books. They are supposed to be professional. Computer spellchecks don't cut it. They can't recognize errors that humans can. I had to give it two stars for this reason. Also, I don't know if the author realizes how often she uses the phrases "too aware" and "oh help". I don't want to be nitpicky, but it's the same in almost every book she writes, and it's super-annoying.

I wrote a long review and it vanished into the Internet wilderness, so I'll be brief. Ms. Price is an artist. She uses words to build a story. Like any most art I enjoy, she uses many little details, rather than a few great brush strokes, to illustrate what she wishes to say. This book is a series of short letters each connected to a longer story. The stories, like the letters, link to each other. A bit

character in one becomes the focus in a later story and continues to reappear as the plots and the stories weave together into the whole. Important for me is this: Ms. Price makes her ideas, her visions of life, known by examples rather than by sermonizing. One quibble Ms. Price: I hope that God does not believe that "cleanliness is next to Godliness." If God were at one end of a bookshelf, I trust that there are other closer volumes (such as: 'Turn thy other Cheek,' 'Forgiveness 101,' 'Trust,' 'Lend a Helping Hand,' or 'Plain Living is Not a Synonym for Cleanliness.' Of course cleanliness is better than the opposite but ... (in my humble opinion) ... there are plenty of spotless homemakers (of both genders) with hearts of rusted iron.

The words in the title drew me in. Circle Letters...what a wonderful idea. It reminded me of the letters my own Grandmother received and then shared with our family. Each new letter was placed in the 'letter spot' on the fireplace mantle. She treasured each one. I was young and had no idea how important those hand written pages were. Bits and pieces of our family were sprinkled across those pages. This book was a sweet reminder of those days. My favorite characters were Mary Ann and Menno. Young Melvin also stole my heart. There was a lot going on in this story but then real life is busy as well. Families grow and change. We are young and in a heartbeat, we are old. Some of us live next to each other while others are far away. No matter the time or distance, a shared letter can bring us back to where we started...home. I look forward to reading more from Sarah Price.

Find books by Sara Price to be the best written. Look forward to reading all of her books. This one centers around a family. Each person takes their turn writing about what is happening. Starts with the mother and comes full circle back to her. Read the first 2 books in 3 days. Look forward to the 3rd book coming out.

I enjoy reading Amish based novels, because I know I am not going to run into foul language and steamy sex scenes. I even have a collection listing on my Kindle named "Amish". I had never read a book by Sarah Price before, but thoroughly enjoyed it. I haven't up to this point read lots of Amish, and the ones I had read did not have as many characters that I had to try to keep track of, but I enjoyed it so much that as soon as I finished it, I went to and bought book 2, as I just had to find out what happened to all these people. Will be looking for more books by Sarah Price in the future.
