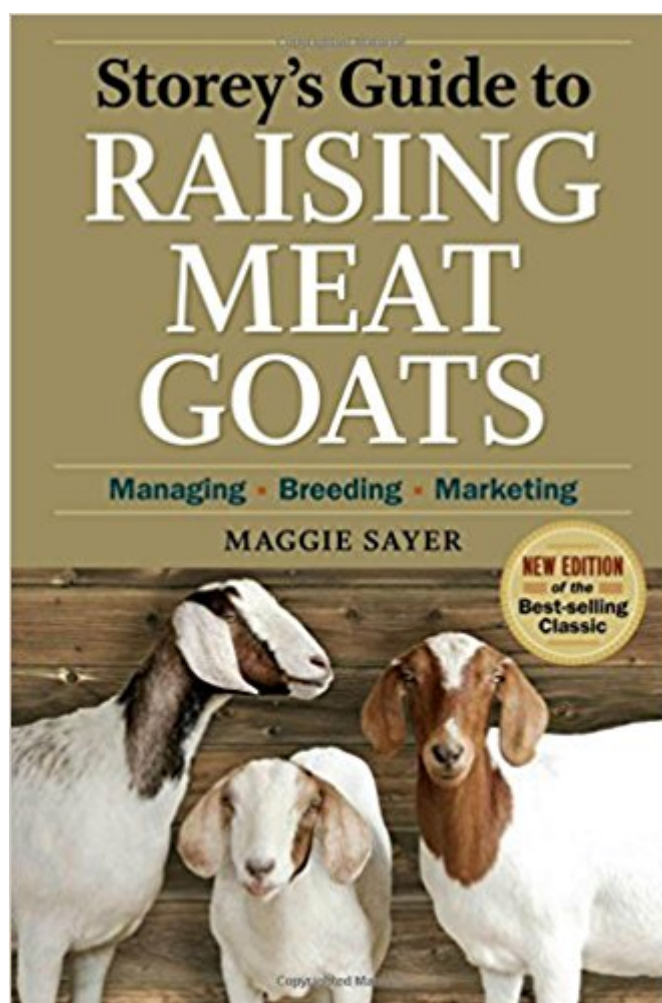

Maggie Sayer has written numerous articles on animal raising and husbandry. Her Boer goats and dozens of rescued animals share the farm with Sayer and her husband in the Ozark region of Arkansas, where goat production has taken sustainable agriculture by storm.

I ordered the Kindle version & after the first chapter or two I ordered the hard copy to have the tables & a copy that can be taken to the barn. We started out just to have meat for the table & I milk my Boers too. We don't need lots of milk. But this book helped me understand more cost effective, efficient management, & the possibility of having the goats pay for themselves now that I have my herd established. And best of all I didn't feel like an idiot & enjoyed the lighthearted delivery.

The book initially reads like an advertisement or brochure; convincing you as to why meat goats are a good idea. Then the next thing you know you're immersed in so much information about goats. It doesn't claim to know everything or try to be the only book you'll need, as it offers even more

resources and references to help you get more information about goats. Really great read!

I've learned that reading about something first- and doing research before doing something is very worth while. These books are inexpensive, informative and a good place to start your research before spending a lot of money on fencing, housing, food, first aid etc-etc-etc. that you need for some of these endeavors. Biggest omission: nothing on slaughtering/processing the meat goats. It talks about selling them- (planning around cultural events) but not how/when to slaughter, different cuts of meat and some recipes. But I guess that it may have been too much for the book and you would buy another book on game processing anyway.

We have no prior experience raising goats and this book as been our "Bible" for learning everything. We have nannies and this book has given us the info we needed to assist in several deliveries. Highly recommend.
