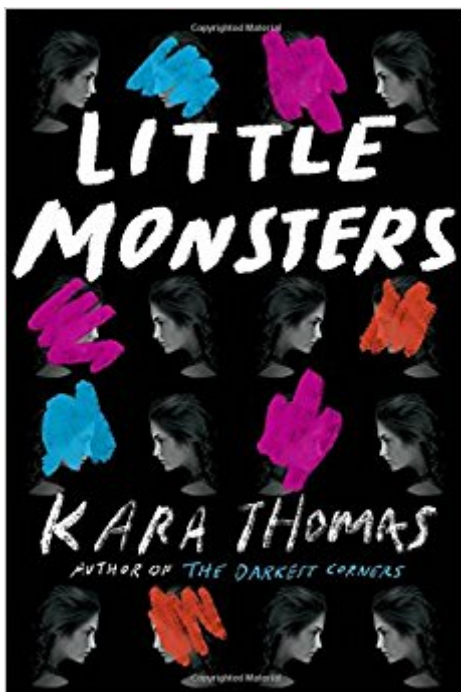

After running away from her mother and several subsequent foster homes, Kacey is sent to Broken Falls, Wisconsin, to live with her father, a man she has never met, and his family. Accepted by her stepmother Ashley and her stepbrother Andrew, Kacey eventually gains the acceptance and love of her half-sister Lauren; her father remains distant and aloof. When two girls, Bailey and Jade, include Kacey in their close friendship, she begins to feel her life may become more like that she has always desired. Following a midnight escapade in which the three and Lauren conduct a séance at an old barn where a mass murder was committed, the girls' relationship begins to unravel. Bailey's disappearance, following a party, further complicates Jade and Kacey's relationship as it also does with Kacey's family. While the search for Bailey and investigation into her disappearance continues, multiple suspects are questioned and released until the concluding chapters reveal Bailey's fate. Kacey narrates the majority of "Little Monsters

Kacey has been living with her mother, but their relationship is troubled and sometimes violent. After social workers judge that it is beyond help, she is sent to live with the father she never knew in Broken Falls, Wisconsin. She is welcomed into a ready-made family, and suddenly she has not only a father, but a step-brother, a half-sister, and perhaps the world's nicest stepmother. She even has a new group of friends, as best friends Jade and Bailey bring her into their circle. They do everything together until suddenly the text Kacey expects to receive never arrives, and soon after Bailey is missing too. Why wasn't Kacey invited to the biggest party of the year? Did something happen there that explains Bailey's absence? Where is Bailey anyway? Is someone Kacey knows responsible for her disappearance? Who can she trust and who can the reader? The author does a masterful job with just about every aspect of this novel. The characters are all well developed and interesting. The relationships of Kacey and her family and friends and the dynamics of high school are spot on, from the texting to the insecurities resulting from perceived judgments and slights. The story is told primarily from Kacey's point of view, but as the novel progresses we read more and more excerpts from Bailey's diary. The combination both moves the story forward and helps to explain the nuances of their relationship. And then there's the plot. What a roller coaster ride this book is! I am generally excellent at figuring out who done it, but not this time. I did eventually get it right, but so late in the story as to almost not matter. The author does a fabulous job balancing red herrings and playing with unreliable narrators, and she kept me happily turning the pages as fast as I could. I couldn't put it down. The ending is a tad rushed, but this did nothing to spoil the novel for me. This is easily one of the best young adult

mysteries I've read.

Little Monsters is an excellent, fast paced thriller that will keep readers turning the pages late into the night as the author skillfully weaves a mystery that is filled with suspense. This is a truly creepy read that takes the typical "mean girls" tale and turns it upside down, flips it around and leaves you wondering just what the heck happened. I picked this up solely because I enjoyed the author's first book so much. This second effort didn't disappoint. The superb pacing really makes this story sing, and helps create an atmosphere of dread that is palpable from the first chapter and only gets bigger throughout the story. The dialogue is authentic, the relationships chilling and the plot delivers more than it's share of surprises. A must read for any teen or adult looking for an intelligent, suspenseful thriller. It's a story that showcases the tenuous nature of teen relationship and the importance of family. Don't miss this one.
